Actively implementing the City's Heritage Preservation Policy (since 2007 – a creature of Council)

Ensuring the ongoing preservation and coordination of Winnipeg's museum resources and assets.

Auditing the ongoing operations of the museums that receive grant funds and inkind services from the City.

Audit | Budget Process


- In order to receive funding, museums are required to submit a comprehensive operating grant application every year
- This is an *extensive* application requiring museums to submit their annual reports, budgets, attendance figures, and detailed responses on how they plan to achieve goals that will add value for Winnipeg Taxpayers

2014 (first round PCS; including Dalnavert) \$1,067,000



 > as opposed to \$168K more




What Value is Council Receiving?

750,000 people visited City of Winnipeg supported museums in 2012 (14 of 40 museums)

200 Winnipeggers are employed at City supported museums

The Manitoba Museum *alone* contributed over **\$21 million** to Winnipeg's economy (Only 1 of 11 financially supported museums)
