

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



This is the fifth quarterly report to SPC Finance on this Project. Expenditures to September 30, 2019 total \$13,978,002.53. The total project Estimate at Completion is \$22,777,450.

Construction activities during the reporting period included Contract 2 works identified in the History/Discussion section. Subsequent to the reporting period work progressed in 2019 to fully open the road and bridge. Remaining works to be undertaken in 2020 include completion of the active transportation path, east side sidewalk, landscaping, and miscellaneous bridge works.

The Real Estate Division continues to negotiate for, and finalize, the necessary property acquisitions required for the project.

The Advisory Committee has reviewed this report and recommends that the report be sent to the Standing Policy Committee on Finance.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the financial status of the Empress Street - Portage Avenue to St. Matthews Avenue, Pavement Renewals, Overpass Rehabilitation and Associated Works, as contained in this report, be received as information.

REASON FOR THE REPORT

The Asset Management Administrative Standard FM-004 requires all projects with a total estimated cost of \$23 million (2019) or more report quarterly to the Standing Policy Committee on Finance. This threshold is adjusted annually for construction inflation as part of the annual Capital Budget approval. The Standing Policy Committee on Finance may also request reporting on any capital project.

Design (Update from last report)

Construction (Update from last report)

The project is currently in the construction phase. The project has been divided into two construction contracts designated Contract 1 and Contract 2.

Contract 1

Bid Opportunity No. 38-2018, for the pavement rehabilitations on Empress Street from Jack Blick Avenue to Portage Avenue, Eastway and Westway had final utility restorations and landscaping work completed. Total Performance for Bid Opportunity No. 38-2018 was achieved June 14, 2019.

Contract 2

Bid Opportunity No. 602-2018, for pavement reconstructions from St. John's Ambulance Way to St. Matthews Avenue, Empress Overpass rehabilitation, Omand's Creek Slope Stabilization and accessible pedestrian ramps from Empress Overpass to Portage Avenue continues.

During the reporting period the following components were completed;

- The North Pedestrian Ramp precast concrete panels were installed on August 10, 2019. During this time westbound Portage Avenue was reduced to one lane of travel to facilitate the precast concrete panel installations.
- The reconstruction of the southbound lanes of Empress Street (west side reconstruction work including sidewalks) was completed and on August 19, 2019 traffic was reduced to one lane in the northbound direction from Jack Blick Avenue to St. Matthews Avenue in addition to the current closure of southbound Empress Street from St. Johns Ambulance Way to Westway. This is scheduled to remain in effect until October 31, 2019.

Work still ongoing after the reporting period included;

- North Accessible Pedestrian Ramp construction.
- The South Accessible Pedestrian Ramp construction.
- Underground work including new catch basins, catch pits, catch basin lead pipe and culvert outfalls to accommodate the new road.
- The Empress St. road and sidewalk reconstruction from St. John's Ambulance Way to St. Matthews Ave.
- The Empress St. overpass bridge rehabilitations
- Assiniboine River stabilization work

Work remaining to be undertaken in 2020 includes:

- Construction of the cycling facility and sidewalk on the east side of Empress St between St. John's Ambulance Way and St. Matthews.
- Construction of the active transportation connection between the Assiniboine Riverwalk and Empress St. E.
- Waterproofing membrane and asphalt surfacing of the bridge deck. A temporary asphalt surface was installed for the winter.
- Bridge substructure preservation works.
- Landscaping

Contract 2 is a fixed date contract with Substantial Performance to occur by July 12, 2020 and Total Performance by July 26, 2020. All road and bridge work is to be completed by November 22, 2019. Planned work in 2020 will be landscaping and concrete preservation of the bridge structure.

<u>Other</u>

Various external utilities have been engaged to perform modification and/or relocation of their services to accommodate the proposed works.

Manitoba Hydro is completing modification and/or relocation of their plant to accommodate the project in conjunction with Contract 2.

Shaw Cable Systems G.P.is completing modification and/or relocation of their plant to accommodate the project in conjunction with Contract 2.

Bell MTS completed the modification of their plant to accommodate the project in conjunction with Contract 2 on September 19, 2019.

<u>Risk</u> (Update from last report)

Due to several committed and forecasted changes in work, the remaining contingency has changed from the last report to 2.46%. The net change to the contingency is mainly related to scope changes to the Empress Overpass bridge rehabilitation work.

The City continues to finalize property acquisition on Empress Street E between the Overpass and St. John Ambulance way as well at the intersection of Empress Street and Maroons Road. The City has "Enter to Construct" agreements at both locations to minimize the risk.

The Real Estate Division continued to negotiate with Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) to obtain a licensing agreement or easement to construct an asphalt path to connect the existing asphalt paths adjacent to the Assiniboine River and Assiniboine River pedestrian crossing. During negotiations with CPR for the requested licensing agreement they identified annual fees and other terms to the agreement not desirable for the Public Works Department. For these reasons the Public Works Department pursued another option to construct the proposed asphalt path through the Manitoba Hydro property at 1 Empress St. E. Subsequent to the reporting period, Manitoba Hydro agreed in principle to place the path on their property. The licensing agreement needs to be executed but is considered to be low risk. Financial (Update from last report)

The financial forecast is disclosed in Appendix B. Expenditures to date primarily consist of Professional Services, Project Insurance, Overheads, Construction and Utilities costs (Bid Opportunity 38-2018 - Contract 1 and Bid Opportunity 602-2018 - Contract 2), totaling \$13,978,002.53.

On July 24, 2019 the Interim Chief Administrative Officer approved a contract over-expenditure of 1.45% or \$198,939.57, plus G.S.T. for Bid Opportunity 602-2018 - Contract 2. The expected final contract cost is estimated to be \$13,896,400.77, plus G.S.T.

Funding (Update from last report)

This project is budgeted within the Regional Streets Renewal program. Funding for the Regional Streets Renewal program is budgeted at the program level and not at the individual project level. Funding sources within the program include Provincial Funding, Gas Tax, Frontage Levy, Regional Street Renewal Reserve and Cash to Capital. Program Funding is allocated to individual projects within the Regional Streets Renewal program on a cash flow basis as expenditures are incurred in the program.

As such, it is expected that the funding types allocated to this project will change over the life of the project due to the cash flow impacts of other projects within the Regional Streets Renewal program.

Property Acquisition (Update from last report)

The City has an agreement in place for a land exchange to acquire property required for road improvements on Empress Street E between the overpass and St. John Ambulance Way. The owner must still register the survey plans to finalize the acquisition at this location. There was a risk that the acquisition process would not be completed prior to the start of construction. The City has an "Enter to Construct Agreement" in place to minimize the risk.

The Real Estate Division continues to finalize a partial property acquisition to accommodate new roadway geometry at the Empress Street and Maroons Road intersection. During the reporting period the City obtained an "Enter to Construct Agreement" on May 17, 2019 in order to construct the road prior to finalizing the partial property acquisition to minimize risk.

The Real Estate Division also continued to negotiate with Canadian Pacific Railway to obtain an easement agreement to construct an asphalt path to connect Empress St. E. with the existing asphalt paths adjacent to the Assiniboine River and Assiniboine River pedestrian crossing. During negotiations with CPR for the requested licensing agreement, they identified annual fees and other terms to the agreement not desirable. For these reasons the Public Works Department pursued another option to construct the proposed asphalt path through the Manitoba Hydro property at 1 Empress St. E. Subsequent to the reporting period, Manitoba Hydro agreed in principle to place the path on their property. The Real Estate Division is working on a licensing agreement that would allow for the construction of the path in 2020.

Stakeholder Engagements/Communications (Update from last report)

Project updates are summarized as follows:

• On August 13, 2019 an updated construction notice was distributed advising of updated lane closure information to accommodate the reconstruction of the road from Jack Blick Avenue to St. Matthews Avenue.

Subsequent Events after Report Period End Date

- Roadworks, as defined in the construct contract 2, were not completed by the specified critical date of October 31, 2019 because of inclement weather conditions in September and October. The work remaining including the sidewalk and cycling facility on the eastside of Empress Street will be completed in the 2020 construction season. Empress Street vehicular lanes were completed on November 5, 2019.
- Roadworks have been suspended for the seasonal end of the construction season.
- Empress Street overpass bridge rehabilitation and accessibility ramp works was not completed by the specified critical date of November 22, 2019. The bridge deck water proofing and asphalt surface will be completed in 2020. The other work required to open all lanes of traffic on Portage Avenue is anticipated to be completed by December 6, 2019.
- Remaining roadwork and bridge work to be completed in 2020 will require additional lane closures on Empress Street and Portage Avenue.
- On October 23, 2019 Shaw Cable Systems G.P. completed the modification of their plant to accommodate the project in conjunction with Contract 2.
- On October 28, 2019 all the traffic signals installations for the project were complete for the project except minor temporary work required in 2020 to facilitate lane closures to complete the final remaining work. The installation of traffic signals mitigates the risk identified in Table 3.

- On November 6, 2019, the Acting Interim Chief Administrative Officer, authorized the Director of the Planning, Property and Development Department to commence negotiations to obtain an easement or License Agreement from Manitoba Hydro to construct and maintain an active transportation path on the west side of 1 Empress Street East from the existing asphalt path adjacent to the Assiniboine River to the proposed new active transportation facility on Empress Street East.
- On November 13, 2019 the Director of Public Works approved a second over expenditure for 38-2018 for \$1,799.85 for a total over expenditure of \$208,191.25.
- On November 21, 2019 an updated construction noticed was distributed advising of a seasonal construction shutdown of road works and updated lane closures.
- On November 21, 2019 Manitoba Hydro completed all the street lighting required for the project.
- The subsequent completion of Shaw Cable Systems G.P. and Manitoba Hydro work concludes the utility work required to accommodate the project in conjunction with Contract 2 and mitigates the risk to the project identified in Table 3.
- On December 6, 2019 all the vehicle traffic lanes were reopened on Portage Avenue.

Appendix C – Key Project Events (History)

- On January 6, 2017, the City project webpage was launched. The webpage included engagement information, a timeline flow chart, background information, relevant documents and links, FAQs, and a map of the project study area.
- On July 15, 2016 Request for Proposal No. 234-2016, for the Project Planning and Preliminary Design Services for this project closed.
- On September 15, 2016 Request for Proposal No. 234-2016, for the Project Planning and Preliminary Design Services was awarded to Morrison Hershfield Limited in the amount of \$729,700.00 plus applicable G.S.T. and M.R.S.T
- On December 13, 2016 the 2017 Capital Budget was adopted by Council and included funding in the amount of \$6,000,000.00 for the project.
- Between December 2016 through February 2017, 16 stakeholder meetings took place where preferences, needs, priorities, concerns, and potential issues were identified.
- On April 5, 2017, a public Open House held in CF Polo Park Shopping Centre which targeted attendees from the stakeholder meetings, a number of external stakeholder groups and the general public. The event was geared to generate overall project awareness to inform the general public about the project using a series of story boards and displaying the preliminary design.
- On November 1, 2017 the City approved up to \$25,000.00 (estimated maximum) for single source consulting to Fireseeds North Infrastructure Corporation.
- On November 8, 2017, The City awarded a contract to Morrison Hershfield Limited in the amount of \$2,888,250.00 for Detailed Design, Contract Administration and Post Construction services. The accumulated amount related to RFP 234-2016 is estimated to be \$3,617,950.00 plus applicable G.S.T. and M.R.S.T. The Public Works Department negotiated this fee as identified in Request for Proposal No. 234-2016.
- On November 16, 2017 the City provided the award of contract letter for single source consulting services contract to Fireseeds North Infrastructure Corporation in the estimated amount of \$19,820.00 plus G.S.T., to complete an independent road safety Audit and In-Service Road Safety Review at St. Matthews Avenue.
- On December 12, 2017 the 2018 Capital Budget was adopted by Council and included funding in the amount of \$11,400,000.00 for the project.
- On December 12, 2017, Council authorized a first charge on the 2019 Capital Budget of up to \$2,500,000.00 on the 2019 Regional and Local Street Renewal Program for the project.
- On March 12, 2018, a preliminary construction notice (Contract 1) was distributed to affected businesses and residents to advise them that construction is anticipated to commence in 2018.
- On March 23, 2018 Bid Opportunity No. 38-2018, for the pavement rehabilitations on Empress Street from Jack Blick Avenue to Portage Avenue, Eastway and Westway closed. On April 27, 2018 Bid Opportunity No. 38-2018, for the pavement rehabilitations on Empress Street from Jack Blick Avenue to Portage Avenue, Eastway and Westway was awarded to Borland Construction Inc. in the estimated amount of \$1,873,608.00.
- On March 23, 2018 the City of Winnipeg awarded a single source contract to Bell MTS (Materials Management reference number 307-2018) for adjustment of vaults and manholes in conflict with the proposed work, in the estimated amount of \$26,700.00.

- On April 4, 2018 the City of Winnipeg awarded a single source contract to Shaw Cablesystems G.P. (Materials Management reference number 341-2018) for adjustment of vaults in conflict with the proposed work, in the estimated amount of \$10,835.00.
- On May 10, 2018 the City of Winnipeg entered into an Electric Service Agreement with Manitoba Hydro for relocation and replacement of streetlights and associated work in conjunction with the work for Bid Opportunity 38-2018, in the estimated amount of \$217,228.00.
- On July 23, 2018, a construction notice (Contract 1) was distributed to affected businesses and residents to advise them that construction is anticipated to commence in July 30, 2018.
- On September 20, 2018 Council approved a budget amendment increase of \$2,934,000.00 for a total amended project budget of \$22,777,450.00.
- On September 24, 2018 a Stakeholder Come & Go Session was held at 201 Portage Avenue Conference Centre to present the final design to stakeholders involved with the 16 stakeholder meetings that took place from December 2016 through February 2017.
- On October 4, 2018 approval was obtained for City of Winnipeg Waterway permit to complete the riverbank stabilization for this project.
- On October 10, 2018, a public engagement Open House was held at center court of CF Polo Park Shopping Centre to present the public with the overall final design of the project and bring awareness of the project.
- On October 24, 2018 Contract 2 (Bid Opportunity 602-2018 Empress Street Project, Pavement Reconstruction, Portage Avenue to St. Matthews Avenue, Empress Overpass Rehabilitation, Accessibility Ramps and Associated Works) closed and was awarded on November 15, 2018 to Gateway Construction & Engineering Ltd., in the estimated amount of \$13,697,461.20.
- On November 1, 2018 approval was obtained Provincial Waterways Authorization to complete river bank stabilization for this project.
- On November 6, 2018 Contract 1(Bid Opportunity No. 38-2018) consisting of pavement rehabilitations on Empress Street from Jack Blick Avenue to Portage Avenue, Eastway and Westway was substantially completed.
- On November 14, 2018 approval was obtained from Department of Fisheries and Oceans to complete the riverbank stabilization for this project.
- On November 15, 2018 the Design Phase has been completed with the award of the final construction contract (Contract 2).
- On November 22, 2018 the City obtained an Enter to Construct Agreement to build the required infrastructure to accommodate the new road geometry for the St. John's property acquisition.
- On November 27, 2018, a construction notice was delivered notifying of Contract 2 construction start.
- On December 12, 2018 Contract 2 construction commenced.
- On December 21, 2018, the City of Winnipeg awarded a single source contract to Manitoba Hydro Utility Services Ltd (Materials Management reference number 1165-2018) for renewal of street lights and underground work to be done in conjunction with Bid Opportunity 602-2018, all associated with the Empress Street Pavement Reconstructions, Overpass Rehabilitation, New Accessible Pedestrian Ramps, in the estimated amount of \$326,664.87.

- On January 15, 2019, the contractor completed the north ramp piling work. As a result the risk associated with piling in the immediate proximity to major Manitoba Hydro infrastructure and risk of unsuitable subsurface soil conditions that may exist at the new north pedestrian accessible ramp have been mitigated.
- On January 21, 2019 the project webpage was updated.
- On January 23, 2019, the contractor completed the Omand's Creek riverbank stabilization work and as a result the risk of not completing this work prior to February 15, 2019, critical stage has been mitigated. The remaining riverbank stabilization work along the Assiniboine River is not required to be completed prior to starting the roadwork.
- On April 1, 2019 a construction notice was delivered indicating the start of Contract 2 Underground Work commencement.
- On April 10, 2019 an updated Contract 2 construction notice was delivered advising of revised road closure for the project.
- On April 30, 2019, the retaining wall adjacent to Empress St. at St. Matthews (with the exception of the railing) was completed.
- On May 17, 2019 the City obtained an Enter to Construct Agreement to build the required infrastructure to accommodate the new road geometry for the property at the southwest corner of Empress Street and Maroons Road.
