EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Winnipeg Transit is proposing that Route 649 Chevrier be changed so that the route travels along Scurfield Blvd and Newmarket Blvd in order to provide closer transit service to residents in the newly-developed Bishop Grandin Crossing neighbourhood. Bishop Grandin Crossing has undergone significant development in recent years, which includes a number of new housing projects. The proposed routing change is shown on the map in Appendix A. Six (6) total stops will be added in order to provide service; three (3) in the inbound direction and three (3) in the outbound direction.

The routing change is to be implemented when the Fall 2022 schedule goes into effect, tentatively scheduled for Sunday, September 4, 2022.

This routing change adds an additional one (1) minute of running time to the route. There is sufficient existing running time built into the route that can absorb the additional minute without impacting service to passengers.

There are no financial impacts associated with the route change.

REASON FOR THE REPORT

Changes to transit routings require the approval of the Standing Policy Committee on Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS

There are no financial impacts associated with the route change.

HISTORY/DISCUSSION

Bishop Grandin Crossing has undergone significant development in recent years, which includes a number of new housing projects. Winnipeg Transit is proposing that Route 649 Chevrier be changed so that the route travels along Scurfield Blvd and Newmarket Blvd in order to provide closer transit service to residents.

The proposed routing change is shown in Appendix A. Six (6) total stops will be added in order to provide service; three (3) in the inbound direction and three (3) in the outbound direction. Because of the change in routing, a total of three (3) stops will no longer be serviced by Route 649. Usage is low at all of these stops (approximately 10 people per day combined at all three stops), and service will continue to be provided at each of these stops by other routes.

The routing change is to be implemented when the Fall 2022 schedule goes into effect, tentatively scheduled for Sunday, September 4, 2022.

This routing change adds an additional one (1) minute of running time to the route. There is sufficient running time built into the route that can absorb the additional minute without impacting service to passengers.

There are no financial impacts associated with the route change.
